We need to Empty Ourselves in the Love of Jesus
~Phil.2:6-7



Philippians 2:6-7, deals with the self-emptying act of our Lord Jesus. NRSV translates: "who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form."

There was a little girl crying outside the Church because there was no space for her to sit in the Sunday school class. One pastor saw her crying and took her inside and found place for her to sit. That night when she went to bed, she was very happy that she could sit in the Sunday school class, but she also thought about those children who do not have a place to worship Lord Jesus. After two years she died due to an illness, but something was found in her purse. In there were 57 cents with a note in childish handwriting; ***This is to build a small Church big enough so that more children may go to Sunday school.***

When this story of unselfish love was spread huge donations came and one wealthy person even offered a piece of land at the cost of same 57 cents. This real story is of Temple Baptist Church, Philadelphia, with a seating capacity of 3,300 people and Sunday school building where hundreds of children can sit so that no child in the area need to sit outside during Sunday School time.

I would say that the little girl emptied herself in the love of Jesus and only 57 cents exalted her in history as Jesus emptied himself for us and was himself highly exalted. Paul wanted it to be in our Christian life as it was in Jesus', though He was in the form of God, but He emptied himself for the sake of humanity. Though He was blameless, He took all the blame upon him for us. Though He was the most powerful, He became powerless for us. Though He was the master, He became a servant for us. Though He never sinned, he died for us to bring us safely home to God.

My friends, we talk about many things, but I would say everything is secondary or have no meaning if we do not follow the Greatest Commandments. And both these commandments are all about emptying oneself. We cannot love God until we do not empty ourselves in the love of God neither can we love others until we empty ourselves. Christianity is all about emptying everything and filling our hearts with only love. Remember this, world is created out of love, for love and by love. But now the only thing lacking is love. We need to empty ourselves to create a world with more peace and love. We are the instruments of God's Mission on earth and are called for change, but we cannot do anything without the help of our Lord God Almighty. **As Martin Luther King, Jr.** said "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

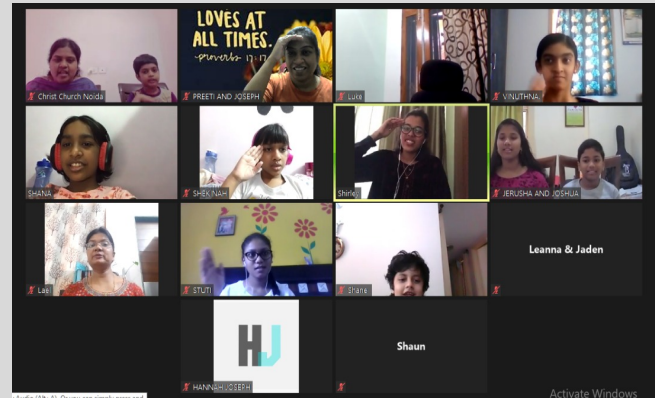

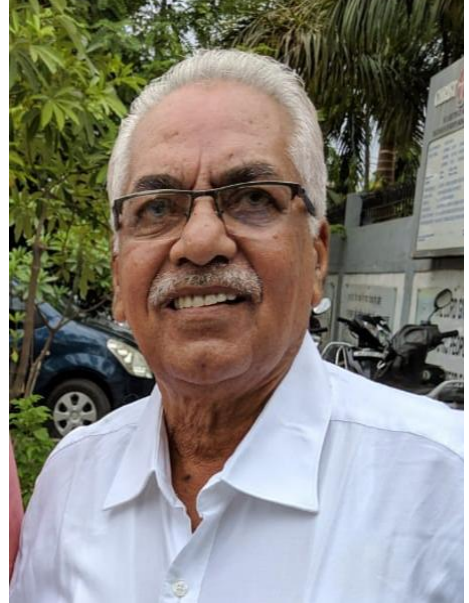

Sunday School Children - The Mustard Seeds in Churches

Paul wrote about the five-fold ministry of the Church in Ephesians 4:11, "It was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers." Sunday School is a vital part of the anointing of this office and God's plan for the church. While the pastor is required to preach the Word unto Salvation, the Sunday School teacher is to bring the knowledge of God's Word to the children. It is relatively easy to preach and teach older people, who may have a basic knowledge of the Bible. However, with children, the teacher has a difficult task of inculcating Christian doctrine using methods they would easily understand. Perhaps, this could be one of the reasons why in many Churches Sunday School fail to get the focus it otherwise deserves. As time passes, they need to be brought within the framework of regular service of the church.



When I reflect on churches in India and abroad I have had occasions to worship in, a picture emerges. While some churches are 'Young and vibrant', many are 'Ageing.' You find few elderly believers worshipping in these churches. We often get to read about some churches closing down as no one visits it anymore. The young and the vibrant churches of today could end up as an ageing church, at some point in time, if they do not pay enough attention to any one of the ministers, especially the Sunday School Ministry. Suddenly they will see the younger generation disappearing like leaves from trees in the autumn, leaving just dry trunk.

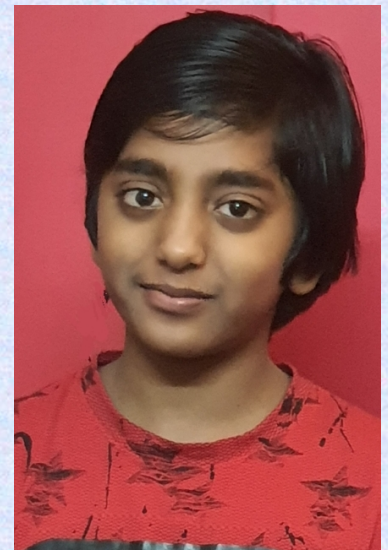

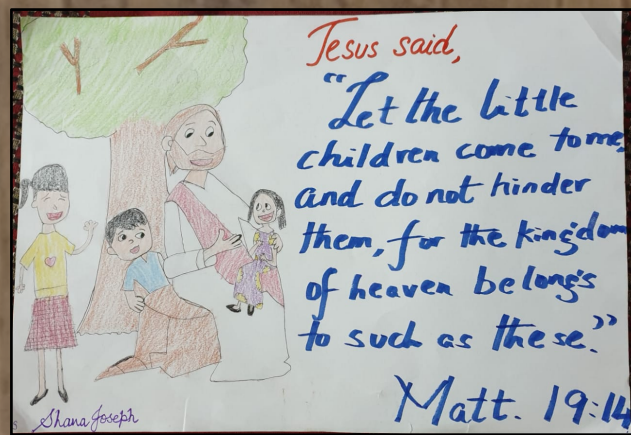
Faith in God
